NEWSPAPERS, JOURNALS, BULLETINS

Australian Communist, Nos 1-117 ([late 1963] - May-June 1983). Originally produced by Australia's pro-CPC communists, it became the official theoretical journal of the CPA-ML after the party's formation. It has appeared in various offset formats: demy octavo (nos 1-24, [late-1963] - March 1967); approx. B6 (nos 25-102, May 1967 - [late 1982]); approx. A4, a format accompanied by a switch to newsprint and in which it continues to appear, (from no. 103, January-February 1981). Subtitles, which have also varied, concern the application of Marxism-Leninism and, from no. 39 (March 1970), Mao Zedong Thought to Australian conditions.

Bulletin of the Committee in Defence of Marxism-Leninism Mao Tsetung Thought, vol. 1, no. 2-vol. 3, no. 7 (June 1981-September 1983). Produced by a small Melbourne group which was formed by former CPA-ML members, including CC members; approximately monthly. Cyclostyled A4 format, usually 25-30 pp.

Discussion Bulletin, nos 1-11 (1 October 1977-August 1981). Internal bulletin of the Red Eureka Movement (see Appendix IV). Appeared irregularly in cyclostyled format on foolscap until it switched to A4 with no. 9 (24 March 1980). No longer appears.

Rebel, the, vol. 1, no. 1-vol. 2, no. 3 ([mid-1977]-September 1978). Published by the Red Eureka Movement. The first issue said that it was published 'to assist in developing a revolutionary Communist understanding of problems of the Australian and world revolution'. Appeared monthly until December 1977 in cyclostyled foolscap format and thrice in 1978 in cyclostyled B4 format. No longer appears.

Struggle, nos 3-36 (29 November 1971-21 May-4 June 1973). Newspaper of WSA. Appeared approximately fortnightly, 12 pp. offset. No longer appears.

Vanguard, vol. 1, no. 1-vol. 20, no. 19 (September 1963-25 May 1983). Originally produced by Australia's pro-CPC communists, it became the official newspaper of the CPA-ML after the party's formation.

Format: offset printed on good quality paper (375 mm X 247 mm) until 31 May 1979; switched to offset newsprint (420 mm X 285 mm) from 7 June 1979. Size (with a few exceptions): vol. 1, no. 1, (September 1963)-28 May 1970, 4 pp.; 4 June 1970-26 November 1970, alternately 4 pp. & 6 pp.; 3 December 1970-29 July 1976, alternately 4 pp. & 8 pp.; 5 August 1976-28 July 1977, 8 pp.; 4 August 1977 until the present, 12 pp. Frequency (with a few exceptions): vol. 1, no. 1 (September 1963)-vol. 2, no. 11 (January 1965), approx. fortnightly; vol. 2, no. 12 (February 1965) until the present, weekly. The sub-title under the masthead has varied considerably. At different times it has included support and advocacy for various combinations of the following: peace; socialism; ~~Marxism~~-Leninism; national independence; improved living standards; democracy; a socialist Australia; workers of all lands, unite!; uphold ~~Marxism~~-Leninism, the thought of Mao Tse-tung!; uphold ~~Marxism~~-Leninism-Mao Tsetung Thought. At present it is subtitled 'for an independent Australia'. Between 20 September 1973 and 3 September 1981 it carried no subtitle.
